I have now successfully performed 11 in utero open spina bifida repair the first such procedure in Abu Dhabi. We have conducted academic advanced fetal medicine and therapy course in UAE and have established a vast academic and clinical network in neighboring countries such as Saudi Arabia, Eastern Europe, Israel, Central Asia, India and Ethiopia.

#### Chief Executive Officer, Burjeel Farha (Division of Women & Children), Abu Dhabi

Appointed as CEO at Burjeel Holdings to create division of Women's & Children across its hospitals in the UAE. Patient safety, quality improvement, clinical excellence, respect and enhanced experience for staff and families are the main guiding principles and pillars for establishing this group. The merger of division for Women's & Children would improve care, access to care and quality of services, lower operating costs, improve access to share in market by running a hub and spoke model, and is crucial for successful running sub specialty services. I was the lead Obstetrician in the Maternal and Neonatal Health Safety Collaborative at Southend. This programme is supported by NHS improvements and aims to reduce the rates of maternal and neonatal deaths, stillbirths, and brain injuries. We have identified the need to improve early recognition and management of either mother or baby during or soon after birth as aim for improvement programme for year 2018. The driver diagram and change package were completed and national data collection and analysis performed as part of Key performance indicators (KPI).

## Lead Consultant Fetal Medicine: (Southend University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust), November 2014, UK

I continue to play a key role (Director) in establishing and maintaining the Kypros Nicolaides Fetal Medicine Centre that is now a regional centre for Fetal Medicine and Research. This unit was built with charity donation from Fetal Medicine Foundation and opened by the Countess of Wessex. The unit was designed, constructed and now managed under my supervision. I have worked effectively with managers at various levels, clinical staff, estate department finance department and lead this new service this has led to improvement in patient care

This unit receives referral from neighbouring hospitals and provides high quality care. Since inception of this unit, I have played a pivotal role in setting direction. The unit has an excellent work culture and this has only been possible due to an open and inclusive work environment that encourages personal development and team working leading to excellent patient care.

#### Lead Consultant Research & Development: 2016, UK

I have keen interest in clinical research and have been appointed Principle investigator of four large multicentre research studies in the last two years. The studies have been highly successful as around 91% women attending hospital consented to participating in research. This has only been possible due to a well informed and open culture of research that has been developed in the unit. The Obstetrics and Gynaecology department is now the most successful department and recruits more than half of the total participant for research in Southend Hospital.

As per job plan at Southend University Hospital, I work at Fetal Medicine Research Institute, King's College Hospital, London. This also provides an opportunity to discuss the complex Fetal Medicine cases at the multidisciplinary team meeting.

Locally at Southend I have organised a multidisciplinary team involving clinical genetics, neonatologist that meets once every month to discuss all cases in Fetal Medicine.

PI for UK-based RCT evaluating Pravastatin for late-onset preeclampsia in high-risk pregnancies (n=3400 screened, 90 randomised).

## **2018-2019 EVENTS study:** Prevention of preterm birth in twin pregnancies - Randomised trial of progesterone versus placebo
